I hope that all of you are staying safe and healthy during these unique times. I want to remind everyone that we have tremendous resources available to residents during these difficult times. If you or someone you know has a special need related to the ongoing pandemic, please do not hesitate to contact us at City Hall. We will be happy to assist you with finding the services or resources that you need.

These are exciting times within the City of Everman. Last month, we celebrated the Grand Opening of Fire Station 19 following the completion of an extensive renovation. The station is absolutely beautiful and truly captures and preserve the historic image of Everman. It has also provided a much safer and efficient space for our emergency services personnel. The demolition of the City Hall Annex is complete and construction has begun on the new Civic Center for the community. Additionally, several of our ongoing water infrastructure projects are underway or nearing their completion. These water system improvements have been desperately needed and will provide significant improvement in the quality and efficiency of our water service. Lastly, we have various other projects ongoing or that anticipated to start within the coming months. These projects include: Everman Memorial Park, Race Street Rebuild, Town Center Concept Design (re-route of traffic along Race & Wichita), Residential Subdivision Development, Commercial Development and more.

The City of Fort Worth is currently working on the sewer line improvement project which will impact E. Enon Avenue. Following the completion of this project and the waterline project, E. Enon Avenue will be completely rebuilt and a new road will be provided on top of the upgraded infrastructure.

The Everman City Council approved the proposed budget for Fiscal Year 2022. The budget for this next year includes no increase on the property tax rate. This budget included a restructure of several departments and operations, allowing for a reduction in operation expenditures. These savings have allowed us to propose more investment into infrastructure, equipment and services provided to residents. Ultimately this budget will provide more efficient and higher quality services, with minimal fiscal impact. The full and complete budget is always available to the public and can be found on the City of Everman Website, under the Finance Department.

Lastly, my door is always open to you. I love to hear from my neighbors on what your thoughts or desires are for the city. Please do not hesitate to reach out and share any of your concerns and thoughts.

Economic Development News

New Developments

Ground has been broken for the new house subdivision on Roy C. Brooks. This is a 202 home, HOA subdivision. Quality homes will be constructed with new infrastructure to accommodate them. These new homes will be a welcome addition to our community!

Currently, we are engaged with projects we hope to see come to fruition within the next year. There is a potential for a new 210,000 sq. ft. industrial building, a shopping center, and a 10,000 sq. ft. building with lease suites.

New Civic Center

Ground has also been broken for the new Civic Center. The old Annex building has been taken down (she served us well over the years) to make room for a larger facility with a modern kitchen (for catering), a conference room and breakout rooms. We are anticipating the completion of this new facility early next year.

Everman Memorial Park

You may have noticed the new Park being constructed at the tip of Wichita and Race Streets. This new, large Park will pay tribute to all Military Veterans and First Responders. A good portion of this project has taken place with donations from area businesses. Another example of how our Business Community serves Everman. A bronze plaque honoring the companies donating to this project will be placed in the park.

We have received Grant funding to improve Pittman and Johnson Parks. The Everman EDC committed funds to build a new Basketball Court, new Baseball field fencing and Scoreboards, and a new Parking lot at Johnson Park.

We are in the process of earmarking Grant funds for new Playground equipment (both Parks), a new Walking Track, improvements to the Football Stadium, and other projects.

Water Utility Dept News Spotlight

As we all know COVID-19 has impacted everyone's lives. The Everman Water Utility Dept has been working very hard on adding all water service documents to our website. We have updated our website for easier access to all residents. We have added water service documents, garage sale permit application, rental registration forms, and pavilion rental applications. This year the City of Everman conducted a regional survey of water rates. This survey compared like size

cities rates and also took into consideration general maintenance and planned improvement costs. The City of Everman is planning to adopt the average base rates based off of this survey. The new water rates become effective May 1st, 2021. Most residential customers will see a \$14.46 monthly increase in their water bills as a result of adopting these average rates. Garbage Collection

Waste Connections provides garbage collection. In order to expedite garbage collection, the following information is provided.

- 1. City-wide pick-up days are *Tuesdays* and *Fridays*; Fridays are also recycling days. Waste Connections observes the holidays of Thanksgiving and Christmas and New Year's. If your collection day falls on one of these holidays, call (817) 222-2221 for collection day.
- 2. Garbage must be out front at curbside by 7:00am on your collection day.
- 3. Discounts are provided to Senior Citizens. To apply for a discount contact City Hall at (817) 293-0525.
- 4. No hazardous waste, tires, batteries, liquids or inflammables can be left for collection.
- 5. We encourage you to contact Waste Connections directly if you are experiencing a problem with your garbage collection at (817) 222-2221.

Court

The Everman Municipal Court as a Court of Record, serves its citizens and guests within the community in a courteous, efficient, and professional manner. The court and its officers process cases in a fair and impartial manner.

Our mission is to provide effective and impartial administration of justice. We are dedicated and committed to promoting the highest standards in customer service, upholding the integrity of the court, and building public trust and confidence.

The City of Everman Code Enforcement Office has been working very hard to address the many complaints that are submitted. In recent years, we have seen a significant spike in code enforcement related complaints and issues throughout the city. To help address this increase, the City Manager has authorized the training of certain Police Officers as qualified and licensed Code Enforcement Officers. These specially trained and qualified Police Officers will begin working with Code Enforcement starting October 1st. This will add new and heavier enforcement capability of our city codes. These codes exist to maintain the cleanliness, health and safety of all of our residents and visitors. Additionally, code compliance is important to enhance the beauty of our community, which ultimately enhances the economic wealth of Everman. Please remember that it is not our goal to ever fine a resident or business owner within the City of Everman. The goal of the Code Enforcement Office is to gain and maintain compliance with the ordinances adopted. Fines are only issued after warnings are issued and the situation is not resolved.

All City Ordinances and definitions can be found on our city website at www.evermantx.us. Our most common violations and complaints are related below:

#753 Trees - It is not permitted to allow tree limbs/branches to hang over and/or into street. A fifteen (15) foot street clearance is required.

#554 Nuisance Ordinance - Weeds, grass, plants, brush are required to be maintained no greater than ten (inches) in height - twelve (12) inches on premises zoned Agriculture - including curb and fence lines and up to the pavement (Parkway Maintenance) of the road/street, etc. No standing impure and/or stagnant water permitted, including any container that will cause to do the same which in turn creates a breeding ground for mosquitos. Refuse is not permitted in public view on private property.

#513 Parking (domestic vehicles) - Parking is required to be on a wholly paved surface comprised of asphalt or concrete only

#564 Large/Commercial Vehicle Parking - Parking is required to be on wholly paved surface comprised of asphalt or concrete only. It is required that vehicle not be parked in the City's ten (10) foot utility easement.

#26 Water Service Accounts - City water service accounts are required to be in living owner or occupant's name. It is required to update this information any time owner or occupant changes including owner or occupant passes away.
